

## Sport Premium Spending 2023 - 2024

3. raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement

4.offer a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils

5. increase participation in competitive sport

Sports coaches working in school.	1	External coaches support the delivery of high- quality PE lessons across Key Stages 1 and 2 and EYFS. Support from these qualified coaches has enabled staff to develop more progressive schemes of learning in a number of activity areas that further meet the needs of our children. Every child will have the opportunity to participate in at least one festival/ inter/ school competition each term. An extensive programme of events has resulted in a vast number of opportunities for children across the school. Top Up Swimming	2	Top up booster sessions for children unable to swim 25m resulted in an additional 6 children attaining the expected standard. This was an increase of 11% on the year 6 cohort before top up sessions began.	Included as part of the SLA
